

Public vs. Private Utility Lines

The City of Hickman staff are often asked where the homeowner's responsibility for utility lines begin and end. This month we will focus on Waste Water (sewer).

Sewer Ownership: Property owners are responsible for the sewer service line that runs through the private property and connects to the main sewer line (see graphic below). Per the City of Hickman's Municipal Code, Chapter 7, Article 3, only the main sewer lines are owned and maintained by the City. Privately owned portions of the sewer system include the drains inside the home or business, the lines beneath the property to which those drains connect, and the pipe and components necessary to connect the private sewer lines to the utility-owned main in the street or alley.



Recommendations:

Water Backup Insurance: It is highly recommended that you check with your homeowners insurance company to ensure water backup (sewer) coverage is included in your policy. Water backup insurance is NOT included in most standard insurance policies and the cost is fairly minimal. Backups can happen to anyone and can cause major property damage.

Call the City First: If you are having a water backup issue call the City Office at 402-792-2212. All afterhours calls are forwarded to an answering service and will notify the on call city official to check the City's main.

Sewer Gas Smell: If you smell sewer gas, pour a few glasses of water down your floor drains, the water blocking the gas commonly evaporates.

SOLICITORS PERMITS ARE REQUIRED IN HICKMAN

The practice of going in and upon private residences or public property in the City by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise and services, not having been requested or invited to do so by the owner(s) or occupant(s) of private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, or for the purpose of disposing of, peddling or hawking the same, is declared to be a nuisance and unlawful unless a solicitor's business license is acquired pursuant to Hickman Municipal Code Section 5-402. Any person violating any of the provisions herein shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100, imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, license revocation, or any combination thereof. Applications for permits can be obtained at the City Office.
